

SPARKLING

- Quinta de Cabriz, Portugal **10.5**
Vegetal tones with saline character. Unusual and excellent.
- Martinolles, Blanquette di Limoux, France **10**
Tart green apples with a little zip. An elegant and fun sparkler.
- Louis Picamelot, Crémant de Bourgogne, France **12**
A happy, rosé sparkler reminiscent of creme soda.

WHITE

- Chardonnay/Viognier, Santa Isabel, Argentina, (house) **6**
A soft wine with a floral nose and mineral undertones. Excellent value.
- Torrentes, Fabre Montmayou, Argentina **8**
A full-bodied wine with jasmine and honeysuckle notes. From an urban vineyard.
- Gris et blanc, Domaine Barmes Buecher, France **9**
Alsatian gem. Minimalist character, but flavorful.
- Gros manseng, Lurton, France **8.5**
White peach, slate and herbs. A lovely wine from a lesser-known grape.
- Aligote, Giraudon, France **9**
A rich and lush wine with lemon and mineral. Great chardonnay alternative.
- Retsina, Gai'a, Greece **9**
lemon verbena, thyme and pine. Very crisp, cleansing and most unusual.
- Pecorino, Cantina Frentana, Italy **11**
Bursts in the mouth with fruit and apple, finishes fresh and clean.
- Soave, Allegrini, Italy **10.5**
A white wine that drinks like a rum? yes! with honey, fig, and banana notes.
- Verdejo, Esperanza, Spain **9**
Full-bodied winter white with sweet sensations of white peach and tangerine.
- Branca, Capoeira, Portugal **9**
Tart apple with acid freshness. Nice substitute for hard cider, with a mythical rooster on the label.

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ROSÉ

- Campirosa, Illuminati, Italy **10**
Rich, big and full-bodied, like the Bugati you wish you owned.
- Thema Rosé, Pavlidis, Greece **12**
Strawberry and mineral. Tastes like the first days of autumn.
- La Saignée Rosé, Château Le Roc, France **9**
fresh fruits with a hint of licorice. great when the leaves turn.

RED

- Malbec, Santa Isabel, Argentina (*house*) **6**
Earthy and bold, but smooth, with subtle, elegant fruit. Traditional, but not anonymous.
- Bonarda, La Posta, Argentina **11**
Big, drinking wine with subtle spice and a fabulous label.
- Blue Franc, Shooting Star, WA **9.5**
Austrian grape gives a fresher pinot noir. blueberry, caramel, and crabapple notes.
- Negroamaro, V. Savese Pichierri, Italy **10**
Dark, juicy and fruity, Dolce and Gabanna does beaujolais.
- Dolcetto, San Fereolo, Italy **10.5**
Delightful dolcetto is young, bright and fun. Fresh blue- and black- berries.
- Kretikos Red, Boutari, Greece **10**
Fruit and chalk, pairs with anything in the cheese cabinet!
- Cabernet Franc, Stargazer, PA **9**
Raspberry, cherry and plum fruits, with a strong terroir of mushroom and spice.
- Garnacha, Viña Paquita, Spain **9**
Very yummy wine with licorice, tobacco and cherry, and a great label, too!
- Tinto Joven, Penelope Sanchez, Spain **9.5**
Young wine is floral and nice, but be prepared for some naughty spice.
- Primitivo, Passitivo, Italy **10**
Dried cherries, black pepper and clove - mmmm.

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
